Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

November 16, 2022 at 6:00 PM

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 PM by Mrs. Thompson. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Nomination and Election of Board Chair

Mrs. Thompson called for nominations for board chair. Mrs. Whorff made a motion to nominate Mr. Hinds. Mrs. Jungbluth seconded the motion. There were no further nominations. There was no discussion. Vote (3-0-1 abstention)

Nomination and Election of Vice Board Chair

Mr. Hinds called for nominations for vice chair. He made a motion to nominate Mrs. Whorff. This was seconded by Mrs. Jungbluth. There were no further nominations. There was no discussion. Vote (4-0).

Comments from the Chair:

There were no comments from the chair

Approve/Amend Minutes of 10/19/22

Mrs. Jungbluth made a motion to approve the minutes of 10/19/22. Mrs. Whorff seconded the motion. Vote (4-0).

Adjustments to Agenda:

Due to illness and conflict, the staff report of the Chewonki presention would be shared through video rather than in person.

Public Comments:

1. Mr. Hennessey said that he wanted to let the board know that the comprehensive planning committee would have a draft ready to read in the new year.

Committee Reports

- 1. Policy Committee Mr. Hinds reported that there were policies for review later in the agenda.
- 2. Facilities Committee No report
- 3. Finance Committee
 - a. Payroll Warrants Mrs. Randall signed payroll warrants on 10/24 & 11/4
 - b. AP Warrants Mrs. Randall and Mr. Hinds signed the AP on 11/2. Mr. Hinds also signed AP on 11/14 and Mrs. Whorff and Mrs. Jungbluth signed the AP on 11/16.

Superintendent's Report

- 1. Financial Report Mrs. Thompson reported that with 60% of the year remaining, 74% of the budget remains, and all lines are tracking as expected.
- 2. District Updates
 - a. Winter Traditions Mrs. Thompson said that with the school completing the first trimester, they were entering the period of time where some of the winter traditions that have not taken place since 2019 are returning. She explained that the following day the school would hold the harvest meal, where families are invited to attend lunch with their children and have recess as one community. She said that she is expecting a full house, and that during Mrs. Jarvis and some garden helpers will be on hand to give tours of the school garden, and introduce a new story walk that has been installed on loan from the KELT community garden.
 - Student-led conferences will be held on Monday afternoon and evening. She explained rationale behind student-led conferences.
 - b. School Garden Mrs. Thompson said that the school garden continues to grow under the love and guidance of Mrs. Jarvis. She said that 5th grade students continue to work with other grade levels to embed garden work into their curriculum and expeditions. This past week the 5th grade students supported their kindergarten buddies to plant garlic, with the support of two of the master gardeners the school is working with. She shared the learning targets of the field work, and thanked Mrs. Jarvis for continuing to help to create these opportunities.
 - c. Hour of Code Mr. Bowdish, Ms. Goulet, and the 4th and 5th graders in the coding club are planning to host an hour of code on 12/6 from 5:30-7. She explained that the Hour of Code started as a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. It has since become a worldwide effort to celebrate computer science and engage the community in coding.
 - d. Computer Science Initiative Mrs. Thompson reported that the Maine Department of Education has provided every public school in Maine with a free mobile computer science lab to try to boost excitement around computer science fields. She said schools were able to select one of three options for our school and

- selected a robotics and programming lab with 15 Sphero coding devices for students to learn the basics of robotics and computers.
- e. Math Team Mrs. Thompson reported that the 4th and 5th grade math team, under the instruction of Mrs. Fuller, has been reorganized, and they begin their math meet participation in December. She also shared that Mrs. Fuller again wrote and was awarded an 800 grant from Maine Community Foundation to put towards an author visit again this spring.
- f. Celebration of Learning Mrs. Thompson reported that the school is planning to hold its winter celebration of learning on December 21st, and will reintroduce winter concerts in January.
- g. COVID-19 updates Mrs. Thompson said that the wellness of the school is mirroring what is the community. There have been 11 cases of COVID associated with our school and other viruses, stomach bugs, and a couple of cases of RSV. The new CDC guidance does make it easier for staff and students to return to school (after 5 days of isolation masked for 5 days provided symptoms are resolving) and has allowed us to continue to move forward at bringing back some of the traditional fall events that I've listed.
- h. She also thanked the faculty as they've begun the year understaffed and are still searching for staff. Subs are limited, and the staff continues to go above and beyond to support students and one another by covering classes, coming in as subs on days they don't typically work, and taking on additional responsibilities. This staff continues to model the concept of #wearecrew and she is grateful to them and for them.
